### PROPOSALS

#### PoGlow

The parks and Recreation Advisory Board approved the artwork at Lawrence Plaza. It should install pretty quickly, from approve to design should take about six weeks and another six week sto complete installation.. All in favor; motion passed. The item will be placed on the January 22, 2019 City Council meeting.

Vote: Dylan made a motion to approve; seconded by Johnetta. Motion approved: 6-0.

#### Living Bronze Sculpture

While the committee likes the sculptures, they felt that more thought should be put into what the committee wants to accomplish this year and if that fits into those goals. The committee felt that the costs were high and potentially beyond their scope at this time.

#### Water Tower Lighting

Mike Abb is proposing using a GoBo projector for lighting the water tower. It has the ability to interchange designs, can be set on a schedule, all through computer programing. We would need to come up with a plan on how to reach out to artists to get art for the tower. Tim offered to reach out to the adjacent property owners regarding installation on their property. Lee and Shelli will meet with Mike regarding the equipment.

#### 8<sup>th</sup> Street Tunnel

Wayfinding is complete, but we have not received a revised proposal for artwork in that tunnel.

#### Community Project

Working on this in conjunction with the design project for the quilt of parks being planned for downtown.

#### HFA Maker Space

Steven offered to schedule the next meeting to be held at the Harrison French Architecture maker space.

#### List of Public Art

Shelli shared a rough list of the public art projects associated with the Public Art Advisory Committee. The committee agreed to come with ideas for projects for 2019 to discuss at the next meeting.

#### Sassy

City staff has received more negative comments than positive regarding Sassy. Discussion began about possible relocation to Coler. Staff will determine the cost to relocate. Members are concerned about the image and the precedence it sets if we move Sassy based on negative comments. One idea was to relocate it and replace it with something else at that location...essentially creating a place with rotating artwork.
