CR-05 - Goals and Outcomes

Progress the jurisdiction has made in carrying out its strategic plan and its action plan. 91.520(a)

Bentonville's CDBG Program strategic goals are decent housing, home ownership assistance, public services and administration. During the 2023 Program Year, none of the allocated funds were expended.

The City of Bentonville is a new entitlement city, resuming participation in the CDBG program after several years of inactivity. While submitting the Consolidated Plan for the 2023-2027 program years, the City applied for an extension of its application deadline, which was granted by HUD. Following submission of the Consolidated Plan, HUD rejected the Plan due to an ineligible activity. The city amended the Consolidated Plan and submitted it for approval by HUD in November of 2023. The amended plan was reviewed and approved, with a grant agreement signed on February 7th, 2024.

Due to a delay in approval and finalization of the city's Consolidated Plan until February 7, 2024, the time available to initiate and complete activities within the 2023 Program Year was limited. In addition to this delay, after the Consolidated Plan was approved there were several aspects of the program specific to being a new entitlement city that furthered delays in implementation. These factors included having to re-confirm subrecipient participation after the delay in program approval, finance and administrative staff training, drafting subrecipient agreements and gaining a budgetary adjustment from the city so that the CDBG program could be internally funded (Bentonville elected to work on a reimbursement basis as a new entitlement, which requires initial program expenses to come from the city). One subrecipient requested a delay in project initiation following a large change in organizational staff, a change that took place in the time between the initial CDBG application and the Consolidated Plan adoption.

Staff turnover also contributed to delays in initiating CDBG projects in Program Year 2023. The initial staff member responsible for the CDBG program left the position following the initial submission of the Consolidated Plan, and during the re-submission of the plan a new staff member was hired for CDBG program administration. Training for the new CDBG Administrator took place during the remainder of the 2023 Program Year, including regular training meetings with the HUD Field Office representative.

At the end of the 2023 Program Year, no activities had been funded, though preparations were being finalized with 2023 subrecipients and city staff. Throughout project initiation, the requirement for CDBG funds to be spent in a timely manner was emphasized to all staff and subrecipient

partners. Though there were delays in Program Year 2023, the city has taken steps to ensure that remaining 2023 funds can be spent quickly during the 2024 Program Year and that all funds will be spent on a first-in, first-out basis in accordance with HUD requirements. The city has made good progress in initiating the 2023 Program Year, including executing subrecipient agreements, attaining a budget adjustment allocation, and remaining engaged with our community partners.

Bentonville is committed to utilizing HUD funds in a timely and responsible manner, and the 2023 allocation will be used for all major initiatives laid out in the Consolidated Plan over the coming months. As of the time of this report, reimbursements to subrecipients are expected to begin in September of 2024, with periods of performance through the end of 2024. The home ownership assistance program is on track to be initiated in September of 2024. The timely expenditure of CDBG funds is a high priority for the city and will continue to be emphasized internally as well as to all program partners. Looking ahead, the city anticipates that the 2023 funds will be expended quickly, and that funding in future program years will not be subject to similar delays.

As of the submission of this CAPER, no CDBG funds have been utilized by the City of Bentonville due to delays in program initiation following the

delayed approval and adoption of the 2023-2027 Consolidated Plan. The city expects to begin funding subrecipient projects in September of 2024, and to open the home ownership assistance program in September of 2024.

There were no matching funds allocated from the jurisdiction, nor were any planned when the Consolidated Plan was approved.

The objectives identified in the strategic plan will be funded with 2023 funds prior to any 2024 funds being utilized. As of June 30, 2024, the City was in the process of finalizing subrecipient agreements for four projects and developing, with the assistance of technical and legal staff, policies and application documents for the home ownership assistance program and administrative projects. As of the submission of this CAPER, subrecipient agreements have been executed.

For PY23 the total of funds for the CDBG program came from the annual allocation from HUD (\$320,831). As this was the first year of Bentonville's CDBG program, no program income was generated and there were no matching funds from the city or other local sources. Due to program initiation delays, no funds were expended during PY23. In future years, Bentonville will leverage 2023 funds to accomplish the priorities laid out in the Consolidated Plan. The city will ensure that all CDBG funds are spent on a first-in, first-out basis.

While affordable housing was a central goal for Program Year 2023, no funds were expended due to program delays. Service goals included ADA-accessible rehabilitation of existing units by the Benton County Habitat for Humanity and helping low-to-moderate income households through the home ownership assistance program.

In the future, all funding allocated for activities concerning affordable housing (such as home ownership assistance and housing rehabilitation) must spend the allocated 2023 funds prior to any future funds. This delay in Program Year 2023 initiation will require more efficient program administration and project completion goals in the future to ensure that the city meets the timeliness requirements by HUD. In future Annual Action Plans, any unallocated funds from the 2023 Program Year must be considered in the available resources plan. Currently, all funding from Program Year 2023 has been allocated despite program delivery being delayed.

Narrative Information

Due to delays in approval and adoption of the Consolidated Plan until February 7, 2024 and the time taken to initiate the CDBG program as a whole, no activities were funded in the 2023 Program Year. The city began project initiation through developing home ownership assistance policies and executing subrecipient agreements but did not expend any funds.

Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

Bentonville coordinated with the local Continuum of Care to facilitate outreach efforts over the course of the five-year Consolidated Plan, including conducting the planned 2023 activities. Bentonville did not complete any activities within the 2023 program year and there was no outreach performed. The city did execute a subrecipient agreement with the NWA Continuum of Care as of the submission of this CAPER, though not within the 2023 Program Year.

Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

Bentonville coordinated with the local Continuum of Care to facilitate emergency needs response and transitional housing needs in coming years, including conducting the planned 2023 activities.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs

Bentonville coordinated with the local Continuum of Care to facilitate homelessness prevention in coming years, including conducting the planned 2023 activities.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

Bentonville coordinated with the local Continuum of Care to facilitate transitional housing efforts in coming years, including conducting the planned 2023 activities. Bentonville did not complete any activities within the 2023 program year and there was no outreach performed.

Through ongoing conversations with city officials and planning department staff, program staff encouraged the development of policies addressing affordable housing. The city of Bentonville engaged in a community input outreach effort for the 'Plan Bentonville' program, which will shape future land use policy within the city. Affordable housing was a common thread throughout the public engagement elements.

Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

CDBG staff held a public hearing for the creation of the 2024 Annual Action plan, specifically including opportunity for input on community needs. No comments were submitted. Concerning the needs identified in the 2023 Consolidated Plan, the city was unable to directly address obstacles to underserved needs as no CDBG activities were undertaken. Going forward, it is the intention of Bentonville to develop projects that meet the needs of underserved residents and collect feedback from the community on what needs are most pressing.

No activities were taken to address lead-based paint, as there were no housing activities (including rehabilitation).

There were no activities undertaken to reduce the number of poverty-level families, as all CDBG activities were delayed due to late adoption of the 2023 Consolidated Plan and the process of program initiation.

Bentonville does not have a public housing agency, but did perform community outreach to local organizations working to address affordable housing, including transitional housing. These local

organizations include Community Development Corporation, the NWA Continuum of Care and Havenwood.

No actions were undertaken in the 2023 program year, due to late adoption of the Consolidated Plan and the program initiation process. Bentonville remains aware of ongoing impediments to housing, namely cost and market factors, and is working to address them in coming program years through the thoughtful allocation of CDBG funds, partnership with local housing organizations, and collaboration with city leaders. Fair housing choice is a high priority of Bentonville's CDBG program and will be furthered through projects such as its home ownership assistance program.

In regard to Bentonville's objectives to reduce and end homelessness, the city will continue partnership with the NWA Continuum of Care and other non-profit organizations that work with these populations to address housing needs and resource access. To monitor activities included in the Consolidated Plan, the city will put into place monthly reporting requirements for all activities carried out by subrecipients and conduct in-person monitoring visits to ensure compliance with program requirements. These requirements include documenting contract opportunities to minority businesses, keeping and expanding records of activities and program eligibility, and recording persons and households served through CDBG projects.

All public meetings will be advertised in the paper, with notice given online through social media and flyers posted in City Hall and the Library.
